After a year of almost unfathomable hardship in Haiti, more than a million displaced people still live under tents and tarpaulins, and reconstruction has barely begun. *New York Times* - January 11, 2011

Over 3,500 died of cholera by the end of December. Experts estimate that 400,000 Haitians may get cholera over the next year.



Many people are homeless and living in these makeshift dwellings. They still lack adequate food, drinking water, clothing, shoes, and sanitation.

Cholera is a completely treatable disease. What makes it so devastating for Haiti is the lack of water and sanitation systems.”
